Sandra H. Johnson, founder and director of Triad Ladder of Hope in High Point, will be with us Sunday, March 5th for our Homeland Missions Emphasis during the Bible Study hour. We hope you will join us to learn about the Triad Ladder of Hope ministry. Muffins, juice, and coffee will be available beginning at 9:00 a.m.

Sandra was born in Valley, Alabama and moved with her family to North Carolina when she was 13 years old. Today Sandra has a family of her own, which includes three sons, and ten grandchildren. She is very active in her church and has gone on numerous mission trips, nine of these overseas to the Ukraine, Lebanon, and the Lesser Antilles Islands.

In 2004, Sandra began working with human trafficking issues under a federal grant. A year later, she stepped out in faith and founded Triad Ladder of Hope. It is a privately funded, faith-based, grassroots, non-profit organization dedicated to eradicating the exploitation, sale, and enslavement of men, women, and children. Sandra works with the local police, FBI, and ICE to safely rescue victims from their situation. Triad Ladder of Hope works directly with rescued victims to provide food, clothing, safe shelter, medical needs, legal process and more as the healing process begins on their journey of becoming a survivor.

Sandra serves as a Mission Service Corps Missionary through the North American Mission Board. (See article on page 2, *What Is Human Trafficking?*)

Gina is Here

Gina Brock has arrived in Winston-Salem and begun her ministry among us at Ardmore Baptist Church. I will venture to say that God has been preparing Gina her entire life for such a time as this, such a ministry as this. Having grown up in that little town south of Winston-Salem – Charlotte – she attended Wake Forest University and graduated with honors. Those were the days of theological upheaval in our Baptist seminaries and a little school was formed in Richmond comprised of many professors from the old SEBTS in Wake Forest, NC. Gina went to the Baptist Theological Seminary in Richmond under many of the teachers that shaped my own faith seven years earlier. Then, one of the most prominent churches in South Carolina called Gina to be a youth minister where she served in varying capacities for the next 15 years. Most recently God called Gina to Paducah, Kentucky finding rich soil at the confluence of the Ohio and Tennessee Rivers. While at the FBC of Greenville, SC Gina met her husband, Chip, and eventually added to the family with daughter, Rebecca. All of this has been preparation for Gina to live and work and play and minister among us. She is ready! We are ready!

Gina will serve as the resource minister for two MALTs – Faith Formation and Congregational Care. Through Faith Formation she will lead our church to grow in our faith through Bible study, prayer, worship, and service. In the ministry area of Congregational Care she will equip our congregation to minister to the needs of those who are grieving, sick, lonely, and undergoing crises.

You are going to find that Gina is outgoing and caring, fun and energetic, smart and sensible, spiritual and practical. The other ministers on staff have already had a staff retreat with her and we can see that she is going to fit in very well. She is going to be an excellent minister of the gospel of Jesus Christ in our midst.

She will live here on her own, without Chip and Rebecca, until Rebecca finishes her 5th grade school year. In June they will all be in the Winston-Salem area.

Please welcome Gina with that wonderful Ardmore welcome and help her feel at home. You are going to be important instruments of God's grace in her life and she will be the same for you. In all this, we rejoice in our connections with Jesus Christ our Lord.

What Is Human Trafficking?

Triad Ladder of Hope defines human trafficking as “modern day *slavery*. Clearly defined, it is the recruitment, harboring, obtaining, and transporting of persons by use of force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose of subjecting them to forced labor or commercial sexual exploitation.”

Did you know?

- ◆ Human trafficking is a multi-billion dollar industry; it is the 2nd largest crime in the U.S.
- ◆ Over 50% of child pornography websites originate from the U.S.
- ◆ At least 100,000 children are victims of commercial sexual exploitation within the U.S. each year.
- ◆ There is a trafficking victim brought into the U.S. every 10 minutes.
- ◆ Human trafficking is rapidly on the rise in NC due to Interstate 95 and 85, coastal ports, the agricultural industry, and a large immigrant population subject to exploitation.

Fully Engaged

I just left a meeting with tears in my eyes. No, it wasn't a staff meeting. World Relief High Point, the agency that supports our two refugee families, is facing a \$400,000 shortfall, or 18% of their budget, based on recent immigration changes. Politics aside, 20% of their staff has already lost jobs. It costs World Relief about \$200 a year to support each refugee. Barring any further changes they need \$150,000 to make this fiscal year. Tonight, Lisa and I decided to write World Relief a check for about what it costs to support a refugee family this year. I invite you to grab a pen and join us.
