

This reminds us of Jesus' death and asks us to lay aside celebrating, thus focusing our attention on self-reflection and penitence. During Lent, the sanctuary choir did not sing a single alleluia. In fact, they crossed the alleluias out of their music and wrote in some other turn-of-phrase in its place.
