“Risen” To Transform Us

Last year, I saw the movie *Risen*. I knew folks in my congregation at the time would be talking about it. So, in an effort to be able to engage their conversations and questions intelligently and speak from a place of experience with the movie, I bought my ticket and went.

The movie follows the fictional story of a high-ranking Roman soldier who is tasked with finding the body of Jesus after the resurrection. Along the way he encounters the disciples and even Jesus himself. The movie begins with this soldier telling his tale to a man who is sheltering him for the night. At the end of the movie the man asks him, “Do you really believe all this?” To which the Roman soldier answers, “I believe I will never be the same.”

That’s a beautiful encapsulation of what happens when we encounter Jesus. We are never the same. When Jesus meets us in the ups and downs of life (even when we’re not expecting him), we can never be the same. As we choose to place our trust in him again and again and practice what he teaches, we can never be the same. Following Jesus’ way causes fundamental shifts in our view of our world, our neighbor, and our selves. We learn to be compassionate and patient, loving and kind, discerning and peaceful. We are transformed more and more into a likeness of Christ – not only for our sake but for the sake of others, and to be a living demonstration of the love, mercy, and grace of our God. We begin to experience life now and we learn what Jesus meant when he said, “I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.” (Jn 10:10) May we be open to God’s work within us and be open to the Spirit who matures our faith.
