### Our Pastor Writes ...

#### *Observing a Baptism*

Baptisms are always special moments in a church. They are communal events for good reason. The baptism of Rebecca Brock by her mother, our new Associate Pastor, was no exception. I was profoundly touched by this sacred profession of faith in Jesus Christ at many levels. First, it was for me, as it probably was for many people, a reminder of my own baptism when I was immersed by my minister in the presence of the believing community. That was 46 years ago, but I can still remember the community, the minister, and the upheaval of emotion that accompanied it.

Second, it was a reminder for me of the times I baptized my three daughters. Each baptism is special, but there is something extra special about baptizing your own child and making public proclamation that this daughter is no longer “just a daughter.” She is a sister in Christ.

Third, I was glad our congregation was able to see a female baptize a disciple of Jesus Christ in our church. The purest Baptists, descendants of the Protestant Reformation, believe strongly in the priesthood of all believers. All disciples of Jesus Christ are called and equipped to carry out priestly roles in the church. It’s not just the clergy who are called to serve the Lord’s Supper and baptize followers of Jesus. Why do you think Baptists typically “pass the plate” to one another in the communion ritual rather than have all the congregants come to the front and receive the elements from the clergy? The priesthood of all believers.

Perhaps most meaningful to me was the look on Rebecca’s face as she gazed into the face of her mother. There was a glow about it, a reverence tinged with familiarity. The minister in the robe standing erect in the water was “Mom,” the one who had given birth to this child. She was one who had, along with Dad, nurtured this child toward the faith. Rebecca had waited a long time (in her mind at least) to be baptized because she wanted her mother to baptize her in the community of faith where she would grow up. The day had come. The water was clear. The call was unequivocal. This was the day the Lord had made for a confession of faith in the waters of baptism.

Before and after the baptism, Gina thanked me for allowing her to baptize her child. Not every church would do that. I told her, “Don’t thank me. Thank Ardmore Baptist Church, a congregation steeped in historic Baptist theology which affirms the priesthood of every believer, even female believers.” I came here because of that theological instinct, not in spite of it. It was a glorious day for me, just like it was for so many others.
